The West Sacramento Historical Society Museum and Visitors Center will have a opening and reception on Sunday, November 5, 2006 for their new exhibition, "Celebrating the Lives of West Sacramento Women." The doors to the museum will open at 1:00 p.m. with Cindy Tuttle, who was the first female Mayor for the city, to speak at 1:20 p.m. The event is planned from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. and the reception will follow Ms. Tuttle's talk on "The Role of Women in the Community."

Over thirty women representing homemakers, educators, civic minded women, administrators, politicians and other individuals are recognized and honored for their contributions to West Sacramento.

Jeri Hughes Wingfield, Thom Lewis and Lana Paulhamus primarily worked on the exhibition with the assistance of others.

The exhibition was underwritten by PG & E, the Cameron Foundation and Soroptimists International of West Sacramento who received their funding from long-time resident Erleen Culver's 90th birthday party which was held at the museum this past July. The show will continue through April 29, 2007.

The museum is located at 324 Third Street in the Broderick district of West Sacramento. Hours for the museum are Thursday - Friday, 10 am - 4:00 pm and Saturday - Sunday, Noon - 4:00 pm.
